4. Description of Financial Operations Systems

The CNMI DYS utilizes the method of Random Moment in Time (RMT) to calculate costs. DCCA-DYS will be assessed an indirect cost of 4.37% (with utilities) or 10.54% (without utilities) for its federal grants (percentage may vary depending on negotiated IDC rate).

- 1. DYS Admin includes Administrator, Grant Writer, Accountant II, (2) Administrative Specialists, (1) Administrative Officer and (1) Support Staff
- 2. DYS Admin prepares all allotments, purchase requisitions, travel doc., etc. and maintains book keeping of all its accounts. All accounts are now entered into the new Financial Management System (MUNIS).
- 3. Allotments or purchase requisitions are then submitted to the department level for review before signature of expenditure authority (DCCA Secretary).
- 4. Allotments are then routed to CNMI Office of Grants Management and Office of Management, Department of Finance and the Office of Management & Budget. Purchase Requisitions and travel documents are forwarded to the Administrator, DCCA Secretary (expenditure authority), Procurement Office and Finance for approval to become a purchase order or approved travel.
- 5. Payments are processed by DYS and submitted to the CNMI Department of Finance through MUNIS.
- 6. DYS coordinates all liquidations with the CNMI Department of Finance.

Eligibilty Criteria: Victims of child abuse and/or neglect and their families; Juvenile Offenders and their families; At-risk Youths; At-risk Parents; Low Income Households; Literally Homeless Individuals and Families or At-risk of being homeless; Unaccompanied Youth; Displaced Youth; Children and Families affected by Disasters; Families with children or adult with disabilities; Community in general (prevention)

Income Guideline: The 2022 Poverty Guideline for Hawaii will be used as the primary criterion in determining income eligibility. An applicant's total household income must not exceed 125% of the 2022 Hawaii poverty level.
